

Thought for the Month

When I ask people how they are, a very high proportion of the time they tell me that they're busy. Likewise, when people ask me the same thing, I'm almost bored to answer that I'm busy, often too busy.

The writer Mark Yaconelli tells a wonderful story about his sons. Every morning Mark tried to get his two sons ready for school and every morning it ended with him having to make a run for it to make it on time. The biggest reason for their delay was that his youngest son Joseph just couldn't hurry. He walked slowly, enjoying every fallen leaf, every odd-shaped rock along the way. No matter what his Dad tried, he couldn't get Joseph to walk faster.

Mark was frustrated by this, but so was Joseph. He expressed that frustration by starting a new club: Slow Club. The one rule of slow club was that you couldn't hurry, you had to do everything slowly. After much nagging, Joseph finally persuaded Mark to become a member, for just one day. But that one day of not hurrying, of taking the time to enjoy your surroundings, to wonder at little marvellous surprises like squirrels and flowers, that one day showed Mark that his son had something that he himself had lost: the ability to wonder.

Our soul is in constant wonder and wants to slow down and appreciate all that we see, feel, hear and taste. It wants us to slow down and enjoy what's happening around us and in us.

It wants us to wonder.

If we keep hurrying, keep doing, keep being busy, we lose that sense of wonder. We lose the deep peace and satisfaction that wonder can bring. Ultimately, we lose the connection with our soul, with who we are and for me with God.

I don't have simple answers to being less busy in a world that seems to only be speeding up, but perhaps the most disruptive action we can take is to occasionally intentionally join slow club and to notice the wonders all around.

Milton Abbas Local History Group

The next meeting of the Milton Abbas Local History Group will be in the Reading Rooms on 7th May at 19:30. Two of our members will be giving talks - a will and inventory of Jacob Bancks, the owner of the Mansion House in 1734. This tells us how richly it was furnished and the amount of booze held there! Also there is a presentation on the graffiti which are in the Abbey Church.

We are lucky to have the Reading Rooms - a Grade II* listed building - to have our meetings and exhibitions in.



This building was in the Old Town of Milton Abbas in Newport Street before Lord Milton had it moved about 1780 stone-by-stone and brick-by-brick to its present positions. We also have a considerable archive stored there as well as exhibition display boards which other village groups may borrow on request, contact the history group <u>here</u>. The Reading Rooms now has fibre broadband access and is available for groups to hire. By the way the Reading Rooms was just that in the 19th century - a place to read books and newspapers.

We are still awaiting your photographs to add to our website "Your Sense of Place". We will be happy to hear from you with your pictures of the hundreds of sights (or sites) or objects which <u>you</u> find of interest.

Our website still attracts a considerable number of viewers from around the world. I am surprised to find that my articles on <u>peasant life</u> in Milton Abbas in medieval times are beginning to raise awareness of how important the Benedictine Milton Abbey once was. I am continuing to research and write about their lives. This topic has put us in touch with two postgraduate researchers interested in the medieval Milton Abbey Church and what it contains, we are sharing information and they are helping us in our research of documents. The Abbey Church is a little-known jewel in a spectacular location and a very rare survival of the Dissolution of the monasteries,

Our history group has an active Research Group which is exploring many of the mysteries of this amazing place, but there is always more to do. See some of the topics which we believe would benefit our research. Please do get in touch and tell us about the topics you are interested in.


