

A story of faith, hope, love and peace "God became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighbourhood"

I wonder what this Christmas will hold for you this year? For me it contains nativities, a lot of Christingles, various Christmas dinners, uncountable mince pies, a few 'medicinal' hot toddies and hundreds of carols. It's always a mixture of great fun, a privilege whilst also being a little exhausting. I can see why the Reverend Adam Smallbone in the BBC TV series 'Rev' gets to breaking point with his outburst at Midnight Mass, as well oiled congregants begin an impromptu version of the 12 days of Christmas!

It all seems a million miles away from that little town of Bethlehem just Five or six miles southwest of Jerusalem found in the Judean hills. But it was here that human eyes first saw God in the flesh. Mary, after hearing the message of the Angel Gabriel is required to make a journey, one that is both physical and one of faith. A journey at an inopportune moment, the last thing that she wanted to do. She travels to little old Bethlehem, insignificant amongst thousands of other places. So often we live our lives in 2D and the Jesus story, God made flesh in the vulnerability of a baby opens up the possibility of a new 3rd dimension. A God dimension if you will.

DNA (Did Not Attend)

<u>Appointments</u>

Over the last year, there have been a shocking number of GP and Nurses appointments that patients have not turned up for.

For example, in October alone **43** patients did not attend their appointments, equalling a total of **14 hours of clinical time wasted**. Breakdown as follows:

- NURSE time wasted: 8 hours 50 minutes
- **GP** time wasted: 4 hours 10 minutes
- HCA time wasted: 40 minutes
- PHYSIO time wasted: 20 minutes

Some of these appointments are up to 40 minutes long, so missing your appointment or forgetting to cancel means we waste valuable clinic time. For ONE missed Long Term Condition Review appointment, THREE people could have had blood test appointments, so it's really important not to waste these slots.

If you can't attend an appointment, please can we ask that you cancel it at least an hour before so someone else can receive the care they need. This can be done either over the phone or by replying CANCEL to your text reminder. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter - **It could make a huge difference to another patient**.

Please don't skip meals to pay bills. Families or individuals can be referred to local food banks (Blandford or Dorchester) by Kelly or Anna, our Social Prescriber's. There are also community fridges in Blandford and Dorchester, and you can just pop along to those.

If you do not have use of the internet, you can always call our Social Prescribers at the surgery, and they can let you know if we hear of anything.
